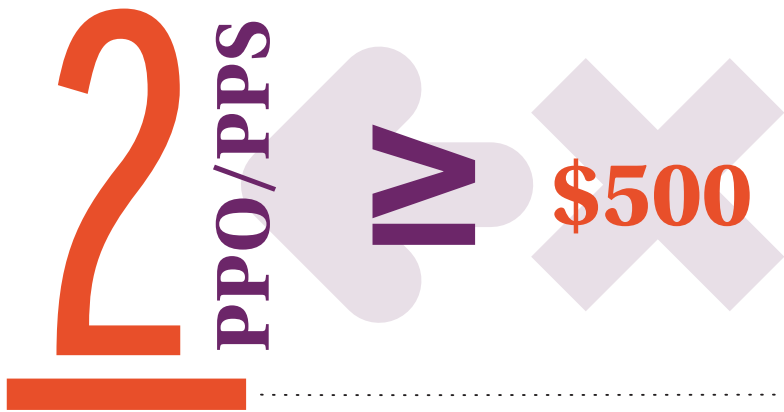
## State of the union: Segal offers state-level benefits snapshot

High-deductible and consumer-driven health plans are gaining ground at the state level, with five states adding them in 2010, according to The Segal Company's 2010 Study of State Employee Health Benefits. The number of states offering HDHPs/CDHPs now stands at **23**. Other findings from the study include:

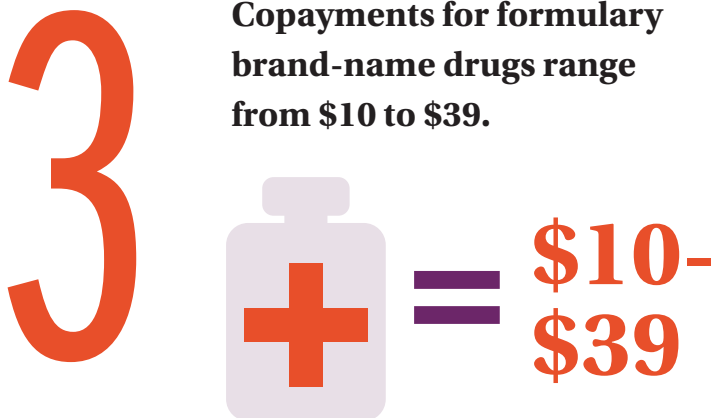
Almost all states (**48**) offer medical coverage through a preferred provider organization/point-of-service plan



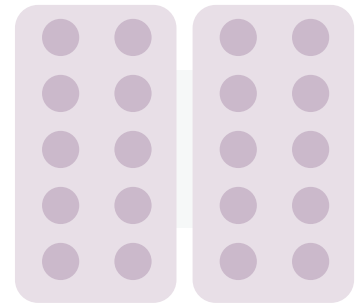
**Two-thirds** of PPO/POS plans have annual deductibles of \$500 or less.



Copayments for formulary brand-name drugs range from \$10 to \$39.



Just over half (**51%**) of state plans have a generic prescription drug copayment of between \$10 to \$19 for retail purchases.



Most states (**47**) offer a dental plan. Dental provider organizations are the most common plan type, offered by **35** states (**69%**).
